#### INTO THE SWING OF THINGS

#### **E-SAFETY**

Technology is an integrated part of our lives and we are using these first few weeks of the year to teach the children about online safety, in and outside of school

We are using the S.M.A.R.T. rules (poster included) to support the children with their use of technology and will be adding to this other age appropriate strategies.



The year 6 classes have been reminded of the S.M.A.R.T. rules and have be learning about the use of 'Phishing' that aims to gather their personal data. They have also been given other strategies on how they can keep their personal data secure.

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Keep your personal information safe. When chatting or posting online don't give away things like your full name, password or home address. Remember personal information can be seen in images and videos you share too. Keep them safe to keep yourself safe.

Meeting up with someone you only know online, even a friend of a friend, can be dangerous as this person is still a stranger. If someone you only know online ever asks you to meet up, for personal information or for photos/videos of you then tell an adult straight away and report them together on www.thinkuknow.co.uk

Think carefully before you click on or open something online (e.g. links, adverts, friend requests, photos) as you never know where they may lead to or they may contain viruses. Do not accept something if you are unsure of who the person is or what they've sent you.

BE SMART

You cannot trust everything you see online as some things can be out of date, inaccurate or not entirely true. To find reliable information compare at least three different websites, check in books and talk to someone about what you have found.

Tell a trusted adult if something or someone ever makes you feel upset, worried or confused. This could be if you or someone you know is being bullied online.
