YEAR 6

Year 6 have been thoroughly enjoying their learning about 'Inuit Art'. One of the outcomes was a stencil painting, where the children were required to cut out their favourite arctic animal and use the outline as a stencil for painting. After some practise in sketchbooks, the children created their final design onto some wood blocks. Many thanks to Mr Power for taking the time to source and cut the wood for us!



YEAR 2

Year 2 have started a unit in Science called, 'Plant Survival'. This week the children have been learning about seed germination. They constructed a Science investigation to find out what a seed needs to germinate and a plant needs to survive. They have planted cress seeds changing the variables. One has been planted with water, tissue and put somewhere light. Another has been planted with water, no tissue and put somewhere light. Another has water, tissue but no light. The last one has been planted with no water, tissue and put somewhere light. Year 2 will be observing the seeds over the next few weeks to see what happens and if our predictions are correct.

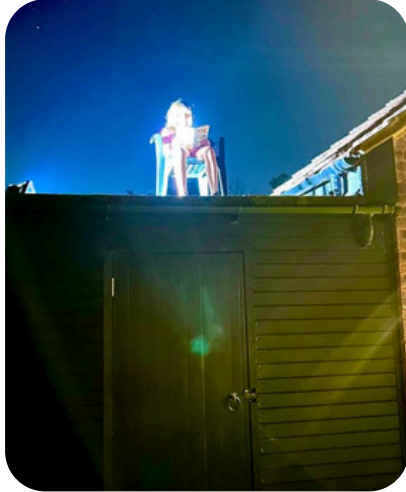
