We found some bears trapped in the ice and thought of ways to rescue them!



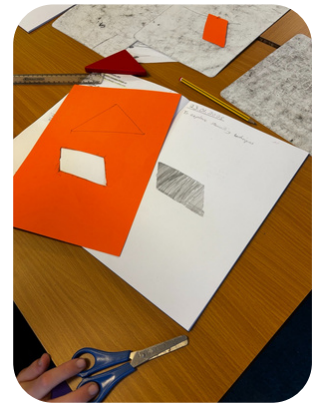
Year 5
