



Remote Learning Procedure

At Martins Wood Primary School, we are committed to ensuring that all pupils continue to make progress during exceptional circumstances through the provision of high-quality remote learning. We understand that the well-being of both pupils and staff is of the utmost importance and recognise that learning can offer a sense of purpose and achievement during uncertain times.

Our remote learning procedure is designed to provide a smooth and effective blend of in-school and at-home education. It aims to support continuity in learning while ensuring staff workloads remain manageable and that the individual needs of families are respected. We understand that families may be managing illness, caring responsibilities or other challenges; these remain the priority, and our approach to remote learning reflects this flexibility and understanding.

In the Event of a School Closure or Year Group Isolation

If the school, or a specific year group, needs to close or self-isolate, Martins Wood will provide engaging and purposeful learning activities through our online platforms. Pupils in EYFS will use **Tapestry**, while pupils in Years 1 to 6 will access learning through **Google Classroom**.

All children in Years 1–6 is familiar with Google Classroom through regular use in Computing lessons. Login details have already been shared but can be reissued by contacting your child's class teacher if needed.

Teachers will plan and deliver learning tasks that follow the class curriculum and reflect the usual daily structure. This will include:

- **Live teaching sessions** to introduce and explain new learning.
- **Independent tasks** that can be completed on paper or electronically.
- **Practical tasks**, such as sorting household objects or creating models, which can be photographed and uploaded for teacher feedback.
- **Instant feedback** and support, where appropriate, to reinforce understanding and maintain progress.

Where worksheets are provided, there is no requirement to print them; they serve as a guide, and work can be recorded in any suitable format.
